



ELIZABETH BARTON, unfairly called the "Mad Maid of Kent", was a mystic who saw a vision of Henry VIII dying and burning in Hell. The King imprisoned her at the Tower and executed her in 1534; look out for a wandering ghost of a nun, still wearing her cross on a chain.



ELIZABETH I was the last monarch of the Tudor kings and queens of England. She spent time at the Tower as princess and queen... and even as a prisoner. Her ghost has been spotted, wearing a large white ruff, gazing frightfully into the distance, remembering those dark days.



WILLIAM THE CONQUEROR built the mighty White Tower here in the 1070s, as a symbol of his conquest of England. By his sword, hundreds of Englishmen were killed.

His ghost is often seen marching around the Tower, wearing his helmet, but be careful what you say, he still swings his sharp sword... and he might come for you next.



LEONORA COHEN smashed her way into history, when she broke the glass case holding the Crown Jewels in 1913. She was protesting as a Suffragette – a campain to give women the right to vote.

Her ghost still haunts the Tower, angry and noisy, carrying her iron bar and her Votes for Women sash

ISAAC NEWTON was not only a famous scientist; he was a Warden of the Tower's Royal Mint, stamping down on those who committed counterfeit and fraud.

Some say a figure in a long wavy wig, holding an apple, might be his ghost. Try not to play tricks on him, or commit any crimes, in case his ghost is still bent on stamping down!



WALTER RALEIGH was executed for treason after spending almost a lifetime as a prisoner at the Tower. Some say the ghost of the seafaring explorer, who still wears his famous feathered hat, wanders here and there brewing potions and whispering his deadly spells.







THE WHITE LADY, as the Yeoman Warders call her, floats and flitters around the White Tower, but nobody knows who she is.

Can you smell the scent of perfume or see a wisp of white mysteriously floating past?



JOHANNA FERROUR stormed the Tower in 1381 with an angry mob, unhappy with the king's taxes. They say her ghost is still seen, furious and noisy, carrying her pitchfork above her head.

MARGARET OF ANJOU known as the 'She-wolf'. was a frightening Queen of England during one of the bloodiest wars in English history: the Wars of the Roses.

Look out for the ghostly Queen retracing her royal steps, remembering the troubled days of her reign... and carrying the crown of her murdered husband



JOHN GERARD was tortured at the Tower in 1597 for his religious beliefs but managed to escape his cell and flee over the walls.

Can you spot Gerard's ghost, which is said to walk with a quill in his hand, plotting his famous escape?



Henry Percy, who was called THE WIZARD EARL. was imprisoned for being involved in the Gunpowder Plot.

The Wizard loved to make magical potions and weird remedies here, and some say his ghost is still seen mixing magical elixirs.



CATALINA OF MOTRIL was Queen Katherine of Aragon's enslaved bedchamber servant and was here for the Queen's wedding in June 1509.

Look out for Catalina's ghost, carrying a basket of linen, whispering secrets to herself as she goes about her chores.

The ghost of a ROMAN SOLDIER is often seen, carrying his helmet and shield, by people who live within the walls of the Tower. Is he retracing his steps across the Roman wall that lies beneath the Tower?



ANNE BOLEYN was Queen of England for three years; she began her coronation celebrations at the Tower in 1533 and was beheaded here in 1536. Some say the Queen's ghost wanders across the grounds, wearing her famous 'B' necklace, reliving her happiest and deadliest memories.
